Royal Warrant

Elizabeth the Second, by the Grace of God Queen of New Zealand and Her Other Realms and Territories, Head of the Commonwealth, Defender of the Faith, to all to whom these presents shall come, Greeting!

Whereas We are desirous of instituting a medal to be conferred for meritorious service by employees of the New Zealand Police:

We do by these presents for Us, Our Heirs, and Our Successors institute and create a new medal.

1 Designation

- (1) There shall be a medal designated “The New Zealand Police Meritorious Service Medal”.
- (2) There shall also be a bar to the medal.

2 Conferral of medal

The medal and any bar shall be conferred for meritorious service by employees of the New Zealand Police under regulations that the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting on the advice of the Prime Minister, may determine.

3 Description of medal

The medal shall be in silver and circular in shape and shall bear,—

- (a) on the obverse, the effigy of the Sovereign within the Royal Styles and Titles for New Zealand; and
- (b) on the reverse, a representation of the New Zealand Police badge surrounded by the inscriptions “FOR MERITORIOUS SERVICE” and “HE TOHU HIRANGA”.

4 Description of bars

Bars shall be in silver and oblong in shape and shall bear a Royal Crown in the centre.

5 Ribbon

- (1) The medal shall be worn from the left breast from a crimson ribbon, 32 mm in width, with a central stripe of dark blue edged with yellow and 2 narrow yellow edge stripes.
- (2) When the ribbon is worn alone, a small silver five-pointed star may be worn on the ribbon for each bar conferred.

6 Miniatures

Reproductions in miniature of the medal and bar, which may be worn on certain occasions by those on whom the medal and bar are conferred, shall not exceed one-half of the size of the full-size medal and bar.

7 Posthumous awards

The medal and bars may be conferred posthumously.

8 Engraving of medal

The name of the recipient shall be engraved on the rim of the medal.

9 Record

The names of all persons who receive the medal and any bars shall be recorded by the Commissioner of Police (or a person appointed by the Commissioner of Police).

10 Order of wear

It shall be competent for the Governor-General of New Zealand, acting on the advice of the Prime Minister, to deter-

mine the order of wear of the medal in relation to the insignia of orders, decorations, and medals that have been or may be conferred in Our Realm of New Zealand.

11 Powers of conferral, cancellation, forfeiture, and restoration

- (1) Powers to confer the medal and any bars under the terms of this Our Warrant and regulations made under clause 2 shall be vested in Our Minister of Police.
- (2) It shall be competent for Our Minister of Police to—
 - (a) cancel the conferral of a medal or bar, or both, on any person and alter the person's records accordingly; and
 - (b) order the forfeiture of a medal or bar, or both, by any person and alter the person's records accordingly; and
 - (c) restore a medal or bar, or both, to any person and alter the person's records accordingly.

12 Delegated powers

Our Minister of Police may delegate powers under clause 11 to the Commissioner of Police (or a person appointed by the Commissioner of Police).

13 Annulment

We reserve to Us, Our Heirs, and Our Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting, or dispensing with this Our Warrant, or any part thereof, by a notification under Our Sign Manual.

Explanatory note

This note is not part of the Warrant, but is intended to indicate its general effect.

This Warrant establishes The New Zealand Police Meritorious Service Medal (the **medal**).

The medal may be conferred for meritorious service by any employee of the New Zealand Police and may be conferred posthumously. Any subsequent meritorious service is recognised by bars to the medal.

This Warrant—

- empowers the Governor-General to make regulations for the administration of the medal and bars:
 - empowers the Minister of Police to confer medals and bars, cancel the conferral of any medal or bar, order the forfeiture of any medal or bar, and restore any medal or bar:
 - permits the Minister of Police to delegate the Minister's powers in respect of medals and bars to the Commissioner of Police (or a person appointed by the Commissioner of Police).
